Syllabus

Course Title: WordPress: Blogging and Website Design | Course Number: IND181

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Explores the use of WordPress as a social networking blogging platform, marketing tool, and content management system for commercial websites. Examines how to install and setup WordPress for a personal blog, install and modify a theme, add widgets and plug-ins, create and format posts, manage subscribers, promote a blog, and maintain the blog.

PREREQUISITES:

None.

While no specific class prerequisite is required, this class is college-level and as such is not an entry-level course. This class assumes the student, either through personal study or formal coursework, possesses computer fluency common in society, including the ability to use a current-technology computer, computer software (operating systems e.g.,

Windows/Macintosh/Linux; applications e.g., office suite), and the internet.

REQUIRED MATERIALS:

Access to a computer with current Windows, Macintosh, or Linux software, current browser software (e.g. Chrome, Firefox, or Internet Explorer) and high speed internet.

Student will need to obtain a web hosting service for class project (estimated cost: \$40.00-\$60.00). Students must not obtain a web hosting service until instructor provides specific project guidelines.
